Strengthening Delivery of Multigrade Program in Region 8 (SDMG R8) Project

Multigrade Online Summit: Celebrating Partnerships and Milestones towards a Strengthened Multigrade Program in Philippine Education

PROJECT BACKGROUND

In April 2017, the Department of Education (DepEd), UNICEF and SEAMEO INNOTECH entered into a six-year tripartite agreement (2017-2022) to improve access to quality learning delivery for disadvantaged children in remote and rural areas. The Multigrade Program in Philippine Education (MPPE) was identified as one of the areas of collaboration under the said agreement.

A national-level technical assistance to DepEd's MPPE was implemented from 2017 to 2019 through the Technical Support to Multigrade Program in Philippine Education (TS-MPPE) project. The TS-MPPE had a three-pronged objective: 1) comprehensive Multigrade program review, 2) development of the Philippine Multigrade Schools Monitoring and Evaluation System (PMS-MES), and 3) capacity building on the PMS-MES.

Informed by initial results of the Multigrade program review, the Strengthening Delivery of Multigrade Program in Region 8 (SDMG R8) project was launched in May 2018 to: 1) enhance capacity for Multigrade policy and program quality assurance monitoring system at the national level, 2) enhance capacity of DepEd Region 8 in contextualizing Multigrade teaching and learning materials, and 3) strengthen Multigrade education delivery mechanisms in Samar and Northern Samar.

ACTIVITY RATIONALE AND OBJECTIVES

Partnership has played an important role in the success of the TS-MPPE and SDMG R8 projects. Under the technical leadership of the Department of Education, UNICEF and SEAMEO INNOTECH supported and implemented various interventions leading to a strengthened Multigrade program delivery in the country.

The Multigrade program review revealed that many successful Multigrade schools are backed by a strong school-community partnership, with parents, caregivers, and community members providing various forms of support to fill the needs of the school and its learners through the spirit of cooperation (bayanihan/pintakasi/dagyaw). The Review also highlighted the importance of school leadership in developing such valuable partnerships.

Support generated from the private sector, i.e., Smart Communications, during project implementation has likewise gone a long way in promoting the use of appropriate technological learning resources to assist in improving teaching and learning delivery in selected Multigrade schools in Samar and Northern Samar.

For these reasons, the Multigrade Online Summit aims to share these good practices and lessons learned from the implementation of the Multigrade projects under the tripartite cooperation agreement and for possible replication or scale-up in the country.

Specifically, the Multigrade Online Summit aims to:

- 1. Celebrate partnerships that promote meaningful collaborative work;
- 2. Share project milestones as models for potential replication or adaptation; and
- 3. Identify next steps for sustaining and possible scale-up of project gains.

METHODOLOGY, EXPECTED OUTPUTS, AND INDICATIVE PROGRAMME

Methodology

The three-hour Multigrade Online Summit will be organized and facilitated by DepEd, UNICEF and SEAMEO INNOTECH. Key officials from said organizations and other implementing partners/participants will be invited as guest speakers.

The online Summit will be streamed through SEAMEO INNOTECH's official Facebook page (www.facebook.com/SEAMEOINNOTECH), which will be promoted through various Multigrade Facebook groups generated under the TS-MPPE and SDMG R8 projects. Said Facebook groups consist of Multigrade supervisors, school heads and teachers who have been participants of different capacity building programs implemented under the two projects. The Summit will also be streamed through the Department of Education's official Facebook page (to be confirmed; www.facebook.com/DepartmentOfEducation.PH).

Streaming through INNOTECH's Facebook page will increase access to the Summit by other non-Multigrade education stakeholders.

An e-Registration through Google Forms will be held to generate a profile of Summit participants to determine if the knowledge sharing activity has reached its target audience (i.e., Multigrade program stakeholders) and to serve as input to planning activities for future similar projects.

Expected Outputs

At the end of the Multigrade Online Summit, it is expected that project milestones, as well as experiences from selected project implementation partners/participants, will be shared among Multigrade program implementers and other education stakeholders as models for potential replication or adaptation. The Summit is also expected to generate concrete steps in sustaining and possible scale-up of project gains within DepEd Region VIII and other regions as well.
