The target participants are SSG leaders and advisers from both public and private schools.

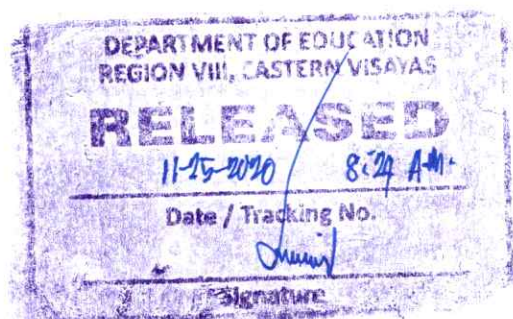
