This is in reference to the attached letter addressed to Secretary Leonor Magtolis Briones from Mr. Hans Leo J. Cacdac, Administrator, Overseas Worker's Welfare Administration (OWWA), Department of Labor and Employment, dated March 26, 2021, which was received by this Office on June 14, 2021, relative to the scholarship programs, namely Education for Development Scholarship Program (EDSP) and the Congressional Migrants Workers Scholarship Program (CMWSP), which are both open to graduating senior high school dependents of Overseas Filipino Workers (OFWs).

Furthermore, the Department of Science and Technology-Science Education Institution (DOST-SEI), in partnership with the Overseas Worker's Welfare Administration (OWWA), proposes the use of grades covering specific periods of our senior high school students as one of the proxy indicators, in lieu of conducting a qualifying examination in observance of the existing Covid-19 protocol.

In line with the aforementioned, this Office hereby requests all concerned to expedite the coordination and collection of all the applicants' Form 137.

Dear Hon. Secretary:

We write the Honorable Secretary to seek her support to the Overseas Worker's Welfare Administration (OWWA) scholarship programs for the dependents of Overseas Filipino Workers (OFWs). These are the Education for Development Scholarship Program (EDSP) and the Congressional Migrants Workers Scholarship Program (CMWSP).

Both programs are open to graduating senior high school students whose parent/s are OFWs. To be eligible, applicants should pass the qualifying examination conducted through a partnership with the Department of Science and Technology- Science and Education Institute (DOST-SEI).

In observance of the prevailing Covid-19 protocol, by waiving the classroom-type examination, the DOST-SEI will use proxy indicators to estimate the predicted performance of scholarship applicants. One of the proxy indicators set by DOST-SEI is the historical grades for the following period:

| Grade | Grades Covered |
|-------|---|
| 9 | Average of first to fourth grading period |
| 10 | Average of first to fourth grading period |
| 11 | Average of first to second grading period (first semester) only |

In view of this, may we request the permission and assistance from your good Office to allow our OWWA Regional Welfare Offices to coordinate with the DepEd Regional and Division Offices and officially collect the applicants' Form 137 from the DepEd high schools. The OWWA shall pay for the expenses that may be incurred in relation to this undertaking.
