RE: TROPICAL DEPRESSION

Per Tropical Cyclone Advisory No. 2 issued by the Philippine Atmospheric Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA), at 10:00 PM of December 12, 2021, the Tropical Depression was estimated based on all available data at **1,975 km East of Mindanao (5.7°N, 143.0°E)**. It is still outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility, but it continues to move westward over the sea southeast of Palau.

The public and the disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take appropriate actions and continue monitoring for updates, especially for the Weather Advisories, Tropical Cyclone Advisory, Severe Weather Bulletin, Thunderstorm/Rainfall Advisories and Heavy Rainfall Warnings from PAGASA Regional Services Divisions.

Further, the Provincial/City/Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils and the general public are advised to be prepared in the event of the occurrence of landslides and floods. The Provincial, City, and Municipal DRRM's (P/C/MDRRMC) are advised to be vigilant and to take precautionary measures.

The Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Committees (BDRRMCs) are advised to coordinate with their City/Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils to plan for any emergency, including identification of safe and suitable relocation sites and/or evacuations centers. These should not be located in landslide/flood/hazard-prone areas.

Please see attached list for municipalities/cities and barangays in the region with possible affected areas based on the MGB geohazard maps and the DOST-PAGASA rainfall data as of 2:00 AM of December 13, 2021.
