Subject: IMPLEMENTATION OF THE TWINNING SYSTEM FOR THE

**DIVISIONS AFFECTED BY TYPHOON ODETTE** 

To strengthen the response, rehabilitation, and recovery efforts of the Department of Education (DepEd) for learners and schools affected by Typhoon Odette (Rai), the Office of the Undersecretary for Administration (OUA) through the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Service (DRRMS) enjoins the regions and schools division offices concerned to implement the twinning system.

In the twinning system, concerned unaffected regions and divisions are instructed to mobilize funds, resources, materials, or supplies needed to implement the intended assistance to their twinned affected divisions. However, due to the effects of COVID-19 in the education sector, unaffected regions and divisions may first consider the availability of their own resources and capacity to engage in the twinning system.

It should be noted that if the concerned regions and divisions decide to engage in this mechanism, the activities in the twinning system are not included in the list of expenditures of the Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses (MOOE) of regions and divisions.

Therefore, the assistance provided by the unaffected divisions should be generated from the mobilization of individual or partner organizations.

The funds and resources mobilized will be used in the implementation of the following list of activities in the twinning system, including, but not limited to:

- 1. Conduct of Brigada Eskwela for the immediate repair of minor damages to classrooms and other school facilities;
- 2. Provision of materials and supplies such as roofing, wall and ceiling accessories, flooring materials, beams, and columns;
- 3. Provision of materials for the construction of Temporary Learning Spaces (TLS); and
- 4. Conduct of Psychological First Aid (PFA).

The implementation of the twinning system shall be from **February to March 2022.** Twinned regions or divisions are also instructed to directly coordinate with each other for the finalization of their strategies for the provision of funds, resources, materials, or supplies needed.
