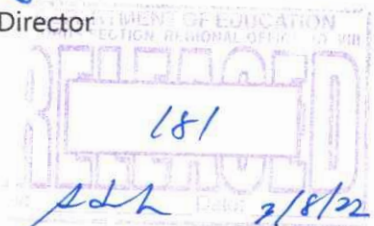
1. The Department of Education, Regional Office No. VIII announces, that **SULANGAN NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL**, BRGY. SULANGAN, EASTERN SAMAR, is a newly approved National High School by this Regional Office on February 24 through administrative fiat pursuant to its expressed authority under Section 5 (B/13) of Chapter 1 of RA No. 9155 (Governance of Basic Education Act of 2001), after full satisfactory compliance with the requirements prescribed by existing guidelines and policies of the Department.
2. The **Schools Division Superintendent** of **DepEd Division of Eastern Samar** where the school is located is hereby directed to consider this school in the budget preparation for its eventual inclusion in the immediate succeeding General Appropriation Act (GAA).
3. Immediate dissemination of and compliance with this Memorandum are desired.

TITLE : **EVALUATION REPORT & RECOMMENDATION FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF SULANGAN NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL, EASTERN SAMAR DIVISION**

BACKGROUND

Based on the ocular inspection conducted on February 11, 2022 it was noted that the school was originally established on September 10, 1993 and was named as Sulangan Provincial High School, and later changed to Sulangan National High School through the strong leadership of Hon. Lutgardo B. Bardo, Provincial Governor, Province of Eastern Samar duly supported with the local officials of Guiuan Eastern Samar. The school is situated at the tip part of the southern part of Eastern Samar and is 22 kilometers away from the town proper of Guiuan. The school started with only 3 teachers in a 2 makeshift classrooms constructed by the General Parent Teachers Association fully supported by the Brgy. Officials.

With the above mentioned scenario, the desire of the community people in Guiuan to establish a secondary school, the Sangguniang Bayan members of Guiuan Eastern Samar translated their enthusiasm into a Resolution No. 013, series of 2022 Authorizing the Local Chief Executive Hon. Annaliza P. Gonzales-Kwan to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Administration of Sulangan National High School for the formal establishment of Sulangan National High School.

The said endeavor of establishing secondary school would surely alleviate the way of living of the community people as well as students because they can already scape from the daily transportation incurred by their children in going to the nearest school which is 22 kilometers away from the nearest high school Guiuan National High School. The said school, can be accessed through motorcycle or tricycle as the only means of transportation in going to the school.

Along with the strong support of the Local Government Unit for the establishment of Sulangan National High School, the Municipal Mayor Hon. Annaliza P. Gonzales-Kwan signed a certification certifying that the Local Government Unit of Guiuan will continue to provide funds for the operation and maintenance of the school while the appropriation of the budget for the school is in progress.



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This situation reveals the actual scenario of a school which needs to be given immediate solution to save these school children from dropping out from schooling.

FINDINGS:

1. The school already exist for 28 years since since September 10, 1993 up to present.
2. There are eighteen (18) available classrooms which are currently utilized by the students from Junior High School to Senior High School.
3. The school site is donated by Atty. Cornelio M. Sison a resident of Guiuan, Eastern, Samar containing an area of 1-60-00 (One Hectare, sixty Ares and 00 centares) covered by Tax declaration No. 49702.
4. The school site proof of ownership is Deed of Donation executed by Atty. Cornelio M. Sison the donor and represented by Schools Division Superintendent Lydia Meras-Lopez, the Donee.
5. The school is currently offering Junior High School and Senior High School.
6. There is available computer laboratory with 20 functional computer units.
7. There are 23 Regular Permanent teachers available catering the 353 High School students.
8. The newly established school has already a monthly Maintenance and Other Operating Expenditure (MOOE).

RECOMMENDATION:

In view of the foregoing evaluation and findings, the team respectfully recommends that:

1. The school shall be named as **SULANGAN NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL** and is authorized to continually operate effective School Year 2022 – 2023.
2. The school shall offer Junior High School and Senior High School
3. The Schools Division Superintendent shall provide teachers trained on the Junior High School Curriculum and consider additional regular permanent teachers to this school to complete the number of teachers required to operate the school.



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4. The Schools Division Superintendent shall likewise provide school buildings, chairs, textbooks, and other resources needed by the school.
5. The construction of school buildings and other structures shall be in accordance with the recommendations set by Mines and Geosciences Bureau.
