Build, Revitalize, and Innovate for a Greater Humanity Tomorrow
UPLB Recruitment Program for the Best & the Brightest

Rationale

Globally, today's graduates are more qualified than any previous generation. They even have more schooling than their parents or grandparents. However, academic success alone has not been enough to ensure a smooth transition into suitable employment for many young people.

Apart from that, the challenges posed by the Fourth Industrial Revolution are widely recognized, from keeping up with the pace of technological innovation to ensuring that young people are prepared to thrive in this new era. The World Economic Forum (WEF) estimates that by 2030, nearly 75 million jobs will have been displaced by technology and automation alone.

In terms of career choice, the 2018 OECD Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA), revealed that jobs with origins in the twentieth century or earlier are overwhelmingly appealing to young people, including professions such as doctors, business managers, lawyers, engineers, and ICT professionals (Mann et al., 2020), making agriculture and agriculture-related courses unappealing to the younger generation.

Moreover, the PISA survey indicates that young people from disadvantaged backgrounds are more likely to be confused about the relationship between education and career prospects. With young people staying in school longer than ever and the labor market automating at an unprecedented rate, students require assistance in making sense of the world of work.

To better prepare the students for their future post-pandemic, the Center intends to conduct a webinar series under the UPLB Recruitment Program for the Best and the Brightest for Grade 11 and Grade 12 students. It will feature meaningful opportunities available for them when they choose to take up the academic track and pursue a degree in UPLB. Specifically, the sessions will highlight agriculture, forestry, veterinary medicine, statistics, human ecology, and nutrition courses.

The program will also include key trends transforming the workplace and future careers. A career reflection will also encourage students to reflect on who they are and what they want to become. Likewise, we would like to inform them regarding the UPLB admission process, scholarships and financial assistance, and other student support services.



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Proposed Webinar Outline

The program will be a one-day event followed by an evaluation. The Center intends to broadcast them live (via Zoom and Facebook Live) and record them simultaneously on **Saturday, October 1, 2022**. The recordings will be available on LRC's Facebook page and YouTube channel. Our expected participants will be students in Grades 11 and 12, but students from other grade levels, including parents, are welcome to attend. Everyone has access to the recorded materials. The webinar matrix is shown below, along with suggested topics, resource people, and the duration of each session.
