## CONDUCT OF THE 2022 EASTERN VISAYAS BASIC EDUCATION RESEARCH CONFERENCE (EVBERC)

- 1. This Office, through the Policy, Planning, and Research Division (PPRD) and Tacloban City Division as co-host, announces the conduct of the 2022 Eastern Visayas Basic Education Research Conference (EVBERC) on October 26-28, 2022 at the Milka Hotel, Abucay, Tacloban City with the theme, "Research in the New Normal: The Future of Education Beyond COVID-19."
- 2. The activity aims to:
  - a) showcase education research conducted by DepEd employees toward strategically improving access, quality, and governance of basic education;
  - b) provide an avenue for researchers to interact and learn from experts and other researchers to further enhance their research knowledge and competencies; and
  - c) promote a culture of research to aid evidence-based policy formulation.
- 3. In reference to Regional Memorandum No. 953, s. 2022 and Office Memorandum No. 510, s. 2022, attached as Enclosure 1 is the list of action and basic researches that qualified for Oral and Poster Presentations. For research with more than one author, only one author, probably the first or main author, shall attend on-site, while the other authors shall attend virtually. The meeting link shall be sent through the email addresses of the participants.
- 4. The presenters shall submit an updated Research Summary, strictly adhering to the format and guidelines provided for in Enclosures 2 and 3, on or before October 18, 2022, by uploading it through the link: *bit.ly/3AJpW8P*. The Schools Division Offices (SDOs), through

the Division Research Committee, shall provide the necessary technical assistance to the research presenters in the enhancement of the research papers/summary. The oral research presenters are required to submit three printout copies of their papers, strictly following the paper packaging instructions in Enclosure 4. The format and guidelines for Poster Presentation is attached as Enclosure 5. The printout copies and research poster shall be submitted to the Conference Secretariat on Day 0, October 25, 2022, at 3:00 p.m., at the conference venue.

- The Schools Division Offices, through the Research and Planning Section, are enjoined 5. to showcase their research programs, projects, and activities, exhibit printout copies of division and select school research bulletins/journals, and feature milestones in the area of research management, through a research booth. One table shall be provided to each SDO for the said booth.
- The expected participants per Office and the technical/administrative arrangements are attached as Enclosure 6, for reference.
- No registration fee shall be collected. Expenses for meals, board and lodging, venue 7. rental, conference supplies and materials, the honorarium of the external judges and resource persons, and other incidental expenses shall be charged to Policy Research Program funds downloaded to Tacloban City Division with Sub-Allotment Release Order No. RO-8-22-0626, while travel and other incidental expenses of the participants and expenses for the preparation/printing of the manuscripts and posters of presenters to their respective local funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

# GUIDELINES ON THE SUBMISSION OF UPDATED RESEARCH SUMMARY AND CRITERIA FOR SELECTING THE BEST ORAL PRESENTATION AND BEST PAPER FOR THE 2022 EVBERC

- 1. The research conference shall focus on showcasing the studies conducted at the school, district, division, or regional level that identify and address problems related to teaching and learning, child protection, human resource, governance of basic education, disaster risk reduction and management, inclusive education, and gender and development.
- 2. These studies shall include Action Researches, Basic Researches, Theses, and Dissertations in education within the scope of the Basic Education Research Agenda (BERA) thematic areas.
- 3. The research summary shall be submitted in MS Word file/format not exceeding 25 pages; 1.5 spacing; in an A4-sized paper; using Times New Roman; and a font size of 11, observing the attached template in Enclosure 3.
- 4. Researchers that qualified for presentation shall present the study orally. The authors shall prepare a PowerPoint slide deck presentation which shall include a gist of the Background and Rationale; Research Questions; Methodology; Summary of Results; Reflections, Conclusion, and Recommendations; and the Works Cited. The oral presentation shall not exceed 10 minutes. Another 10 minutes shall be allotted for the question and answer portion with the panel of judges for each presenter.
- 5. Authors shall submit the soft copy of the research summary observing the prescribed format by uploading it through **bit.ly/3AJpW8P** under the corresponding folders not later than **October 18, 2022.** Qualified authors shall prepare and submit a PowerPoint slide deck on or before **October 20, 2022,** using the slide deck template that can be downloaded from the aforementioned link. Submissions beyond the stated deadlines shall no longer be considered.

6. The rubrics to be used in rating the research summary are presented as follows:

The results shall describe what the researcher found out from his/her study and the discussion shall explain the significance of those findings.

- 1. The oral research presenters are required to submit three printout copies of their papers, strictly following the paper packaging instructions.
- 2. The printout copies of the research papers shall be submitted to the Conference Secretariat on Day 0, October 25, 2022, at 3:00 p.m., at the conference venue.
- 3. The research summary shall not exceed 25 pages; with 1.5 spacing; in an A4-sized paper; using Times New Roman; and a font size of 11, observing the attached template in Enclosure 3.
- 4. For uniformity, the copies of the papers shall be placed in an A4-sized or short white sliding folder.

#### FORMAT AND GUIDELINES FOR THE RESEARCH POSTER

- 1. The research posters shall be submitted to the Conference Secretariat on Day 0, October 25, 2022, at 3:00 p.m., at the conference venue.
- 2. For uniformity, poster presentations shall be mounted on an X-stand that shall be provided by the conference organizer.
- 3. Presenters are advised to use a one-piece vertical (portrait) tarpaulin layout measuring 5x2 feet. The poster should include the Abstract, Background and Rationale, Research Questions, Methodology, Discussion of Results, Reflections or Conclusions, Recommendations, and References.
- 4. The research poster should provide a clean and consistent layout, emphasize research questions and results, utilize purposeful graphics and visuals, have readily accessible text, and include citations as well as contact information.
- 5. Important information should be readable from about 10 feet away. The title should be short and draws interest. Word count shall be about 800 to 1500 words.
- 6. The use of bullets, numbering, and headlines and the effective use of graphics, color, and fonts shall be considered.
- 7. The posters shall be displayed in the designated area throughout the three-day Conference.
