

### 2023 NATIONAL LITERACY CONFERENCE

To: Undersecretaries Assistant Secretaries Minister of Basic, Higher, and Technical Education, BARMM Bureau and Service Directors Regional Directors Schools Division Superintendents Public and Private Elementary and Secondary School Heads All Others Concerned

- In celebration of the annual Literacy Week, as stipulated in Presidential Proclamation No. 239, s. 1993 titled Declaring the Period from September 2 to 8 of Every Year as Literacy Week and DepEd Memorandum No. 072, s. 2019 titled Annual Celebration of the Literacy Week, the Department of Education (DepEd), through the Literacy Coordinating Council (LCC), announces the conduct of the 2023 National **Literacy Conference (NLC)** with the theme, Building a Culture of Literacy: The Power of Communities as Catalysts of Literacy Development, which will be held on October 10-13, 2023 inclusive of travel time at a venue that will be announced later. The 2023 NLC will be live-streamed simultaneously on DepEd Philippines and Literacy Coordinating Council's Facebook pages.
- The 2023 NLC highlights the role that communities play in fostering and promoting literacy skills among learners and individuals through its four sub-themes, namely, (1) Building a Culture of Literacy Towards a MATATAG Nation, (2) Strengthening Intercultural and Inclusive Teaching and Learning Practices, (3) Recognizing the Vital Role of Communities in Literacy Development, and (4) Advancing Literacy Through Research and Development. It hopes to signify the importance of creating a culture of literacy where communities are inspired to enhance and provide educational opportunities, advocate for lifelong learning, and empower community members to participate actively in society.
- 3. The 2023 NLC specifically aims to:
  - a. Increase awareness of key education stakeholders on the current initiatives of the Department of Education geared on building a culture of literacy;
  - b. Strengthen intercultural and inclusive teaching and learning practices in an ever-changing education landscape;
  - c. Intensify stakeholder participation in community-based literacy development; and
  - d. Gather policy recommendations that may influence, shape, or impact approaches, strategies, and mechanisms at the national and local level in building a culture of literacy in the country.

- 4. Call for Papers. This year, in fulfillment of the objective to gather policy recommendations, an open call for research studies/papers relevant to literacy will be launched. Interested scholars, teachers, professionals, and other researchers may submit their abstract and other relevant requirements to the LCC Secretariat through the link: <a href="https://bit.ly/2023NLC CallForResearch">https://bit.ly/2023NLC CallForResearch</a> on or before September 8, 2023 (Friday). Specific guidelines on the submission of entries are found on Enclosure No. 2 Guidelines on the Call for Papers.

- 7. The first meal to be served for the conference is lunch on **October 10, 2023** (Tuesday) and the last meal will be AM snacks on **October 13, 2023** (Friday). Expenses to be incurred by the participants beyond these dates shall be on their personal account.
- 8. Board and lodging expenses will be charged to LCC Secretariat funds through the National Literacy Policies and Programs (NLPP) while transportation expenses of the official participants will be charged to local funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

### GUIDELINES ON THE CALL FOR PAPERS

In fulfillment of one of the objectives of this year's National Literacy Conference (NLC) which is to gather policy recommendations that may influence, shape, or impact approaches, strategies, and mechanisms at the national and local level in building a culture of literacy in the country, the LCC hereby issues the guidelines on the Call for Papers.

- 1. Target Participants. Scholars, academicians, teachers, professionals, and other researchers are invited to submit their abstracts and original research articles to the LCC Secretariat who, if selected and qualified, will present their paper at the 2023 National Literacy Conference which will be held in Ecotech Center, Cebu City, and will be live-streamed through the Facebook pages of DepEd Philippines and Literacy Coordinating Council.
- 2. Research Topics. The papers must focus on the following topics:
  - Intercultural and Inclusive Education. This topic aims to explore the
    impact of culturally responsive teaching strategies on academic
    achievement and diverse student populations, investigate the effectiveness
    of inclusive educational policies in promoting equal opportunities and
    reducing achievement gaps and analyze the role of intercultural
    competence development in fostering understanding and empathy in
    educational settings.
  - Community-based Literacy Development. This topic aims to assess the
    effectiveness of community-led literacy programs in enhancing reading and
    writing skills among marginalized populations, investigate the role of
    parental involvement in community-based literacy initiatives and its impact
    on children's literacy outcomes, and examine the partnership between
    schools, libraries, and local organizations in promoting community-based
    literacy development.
  - Literacy Teaching Pedagogies. This topic aims to investigate the impact
    of technology integration in literacy instruction on student engagement and
    learning outcomes, explore the effectiveness of differentiated instruction in
    meeting the diverse literacy needs of students and examine the influence of
    teacher professional development programs on instructional practices and
    student literacy achievement.
  - Local Literacy Governance. This topic aims to analyze the role of local government policies in promoting literacy initiatives and improving literacy rates within a community, investigate the collaboration and coordination among stakeholders in developing comprehensive literacy plans at the local level, assess the impact of community-based literacy assessments and interventions on literacy governance and outcomes, and raise awareness on the importance of resource mobilization and management, among many others.
  - Stakeholder Engagement in Literacy. This topic aims to examine the role and contribution of community organizations, associations, and businesses in supporting literacy initiatives and fostering a culture of

reading, investigate the effective strategies for engaging families in supporting literacy development at home and in the community and analyze the impact of volunteer tutoring programs and other literacy initiatives on student literacy outcomes and community engagement.

- 3. Submission of Entries and Documentary Requirements. Researchers may submit their abstracts to the LCC Secretariat through the link: <a href="https://bit.ly/2023NLC CallForResearch">https://bit.ly/2023NLC CallForResearch</a>. The following requirements must be observed in their submission:
  - Abstracts must be between 200 to 300 words with not more than six (6) keywords. It must contain the following: problem, participants, research design, methods, major conclusions, and policy recommendations.
  - A copy of the research article must also be provided for easy reference of the LCC Research Evaluation Committee. The article must observe the Introduction, Methods, Results, and Discussion (IMRD) Format with a maximum of 5000 words following the APA 7th Edition style in its references and citations section.
  - Entries must be typewritten in **Times New Roman**, font size **12** and **1.5** spacing, the margin must be one inch on all sides, and must be submitted in Word document format. References must follow the APA 7th Edition style.
- 4. Timeline of Activities. For the participants' guidance and information, the following indicative dates relative to the Call for Papers are as follows:
  - September 8, 2023 (Friday) Deadline for the submission of entries;
  - September 11 to September 22, 2023 Evaluation of entries by the LCC Research Evaluation Committee;
  - **September 25, 2023** (Monday)— Notification of qualified entries that will be presented during the 2023 NLC;
  - September 29, 2023 (Friday) Deadline for the slide presentation of qualified entries subject for review of the LCC Research Evaluation Committee:
  - October 12, 2023 (Thursday) Presentation of the papers during the 2023 NLC.
