THEME: MATATAG: Cultivating Values and Peace Towards Sustainable Excellence
November 25 and December 02, 2023

Rationale

APNIEVE-Philippines empowers individuals and institutions in promoting the values of Peace, Human Rights, Democracy, and Sustainable Development. It establishes networks and partnerships with local and international institutions interested in values education. It recognizes the crucial role of education.

Aligned with this mission, the DepEd MATATAG initiative aims to intensify the values formation of learners in the curriculum and teaching, embedding a culture of peace to address basic education challenges (DM 25 S.2023). The DepEd Order 13 s. 2023 adopts the National Learning Recovery Program (NLRP) in the Department of Education, prioritizing the socio-emotional needs of learners. Schools are encouraged to continuously assess the need for mental health intervention and psychosocial support, with strengthened referral systems to meet these needs. Comprehensive support services and professional development opportunities are provided to address the social and mental well-being of learners and school personnel.

According to Regional Memorandum 137. S. 2018, dated August 30, 2018, stated the Regional Observance of the Filipino values Month. MaTIK(Mabuting Tao, Itatanghal Ko)

- 1. All participants must be bona fide students of a public and private Elementary, Junior, and Senior High school in their respective division.
- 2. Contestants, coaches, and trainers must be duly endorsed by their respective superintendent using the Registration Form provided. Strictly ONE (1) representative per level to represent their division.
- 3. Research and select a character from the Bible, history, or contemporary society known for their good qualities, virtues, and positive impact on society. Consider characters with values that align with your own principles and those you can authentically portray.
- 4. Study your chosen character extensively. Read their biographies, writings, speeches, and historical context. Understand their beliefs, values, motivations, and the challenges they faced.
- 5.Record yourself portraying the character for a minimum of 3 minutes and a maximum of 5 minutes.
- 6. The decision of the Judges shall be final and non-appealable.
- 7.The MaTIK(Mabuting Tao, Itatanghal Ko) the recorded video and script must be sent on or before November 17,2023 using apnievematik@gmail.com. Upon sending your entry, please follow this format for you file name: Region_Division_School.

Criteria for Judging

Content of Script (30%)

- This criterion assesses the quality and relevance of the script used in the impersonation. Is the script well-written, informative, and engaging, conveys the character's virtues, values, and historical significance?

Characterization (30%)-Characterization focuses on how authentically and convincingly the impersonator embodies the character. It includes aspects like mannerisms, speech, and behavior, convey the character's virtues, and how closely they resemble the historical or contemporary figure.

Costume and Props (20%)

- This criterion considers the visual aspects of the impersonation, including costume, accessories, and props. The impersonator's appearance and props are historically accurate and effectively enhance the portrayal. impersonations pay attention to detail and successfully transport the audience to the character's time and place.

Creativity and Delivery (20%)

 Creativity and delivery evaluate the impersonator's ability to engage the audience and present the character in a unique and memorable ways, creative approaches in how the character's virtues and values are communicated, as well as the overall impact on the audience.



INFOMERCIAL VALUE LADEN CONTEST

- 1. All participants must be bona fide students of a public and private Junior and Senior High school in their respective division.
- Contestants, coaches, and trainers must be duly endorsed by their respective superintendent using the Registration Form provided. Strictly ONE (1) representative per level to represent their division.
- Informercial entries could be in Tagalog or English. It must be at least 3 minutes and not exceed to 5 minutes.
- Entry must capture values excerpted from RA 11476 GMRC and Values Education Act and the theme.
- The decision of the Judges shall be final and non-appealable.

- All participants must be bona fide students of a public and private Elementary, Junior, Senior High school, and teachers in their respective division.
- Contestants, coaches, and trainers must be duly endorsed by their respective superintendent using the Registration Form provided. Strictly ONE (1) representative per level to represent their division.
- Each Group will create a video using the TikTok app with a time limit of 45-60 seconds.
 A one-point deduction for very exceeding second to the total score.
- 4. Each group will have a maximum of three (5) members.
- 5. The members can be composed of all males or females, or any combination thereof.
- The TikTok dance number must have an accompaniment of any music which is related to the theme.
- The use of appropriate sound and clothing is a must. No profanity, No inappropriate language, inappropriate skit/dance/appearance, No inappropriate gestures, and no vulgar words.

- Contestants, coaches, and trainers must be duly endorsed by their respective superintendent using the Registration Form provided. Strictly ONE (1) representative per level to represent their division.
- 3. Minimum of participants is 10 and maximum of 20 including instrumentalist and others.
- 4. The jingle should be in English or Tagalog, it must be Original Music, and copying of tune or lyrics in an existing song is PROHIBITED. Use of language should subscribe to the standard rules of decency.
- 5. Each jingle must not exceed 4 minutes. Every exceeding minute corresponds to one (1) point deduction from the total score.
- 6. The Official Jingle entry must be in the form of music video (MTV)and must anchored to the theme.
- 7. In doing the MTV, the contestants can use place and/or things which are related to their performance. In video editing, participants can use Adobe Premiere, Power Director, Sony Vegas, and the like

- c. 20% Aesthetic appeal (overall concept, video technicalities)



Sabayang Pagbigkas

- 1. All participants must be bona fide students of a public and private Junior, Senior High school in their respective division.
- 2. Contestants, coaches, and trainers must be duly endorsed by their respective superintendent using the Registration Form provided. Strictly ONE (1) representative per level to represent their division.
- 3. Minimum of participants is 20 and maximum of 30 members excluding props men, technical and the like.
- 4. There shall be one (1) contest piece. The contest piece shall be given three (3) weeks before the contest. The provided piece should be delivered within 7 to 10 minutes. This includes the group's entrance to and exit. If the performance exceeds the allotted time, a 1-point deduction from the total score will be made. THERE WILL BE NO LIVE PERFORMANCE during the event.
- 5. The use of lights, sounds, props, and other digital gadgets is allowed. Killing of animal/s and indecent movement is strictly prohibited. Any Use of language should subscribe to the standard rules of decency.
- The contest proper will be on December 2,2023, 8:00 AM onwards.
- The decision of the members of the board of judges is final and irrevocable.

Criteria for Judging

- Interpretation (way the piece is internalized & presented) 30 %
- Delivery (quality of voice, fluency, pronunciation, blending & harmony) 30%
- Stage Presence (stage poise, eye contact & audience impact) 20%
- Costume & Sound Effects (attire is related to concept, sound production) 10%
- Mastery of Piece 10%
