

  - c. Could you describe the support and accommodations you've received from your school or workplace as well as from your teachers, co-learner or colleagues that have contributed to your success?
  - d. How has your experience as a deaf or hard of hearing learner or employee shaped your perspective on diversity and inclusion in the school or in the workplace, and what advice would you give to others seeking to create a more inclusive environment?
  - e. Can you share a specific achievement or project that you're particularly proud of, and the journey you took to accomplish it. highlighting any unique experiences related to your deafness?
- 5. Share a closing statement or famous tagline to formally end the video recording.

2. Number of viog entries will depend on the school-based committee.


3. This is open to all Deaf and Hard of hearing learners for SY 2023-2024 which can be in a maximum of 4 members in a group. Each group should submit one (1) entry that focus on the NDAW sub-theme.

4. School-based committee will select three (3) winners (1st place, 2st place, 3rd place). Each will receive certificate of recognition and token (whenever available). The judges' decision declaring the winners is final and irrevocable.

5. Each viog entry will be based on the following:

Criteria	Weight
FSL Execution: Comprehensive usage of FSL parameters [handshape, location, palm orientation, movement and non-manual signals]	30%
Originality and Creativity: The vlog entry is unique and delivers extraordinary perspective, content and approach that makes it a captivating and engaging to the audience.	30%
Technical quality: Adherence to the requirements such as the acceptable and accessible format for all kinds of viewers (captions/sub-titles, descriptive audio and the likes).	20%
Relevance to the NDAW sub-theme: The vlog entry comprehensively conveyed the intended message recognizing the vlogger's ability to stay on point and to the theme provided.	10%
Virtual Audience Impact: Measure of audience reaction garnering highest number of heart reaction to the viog entry via any chosen platform (Facebook, Twitter, Tiktok, Instagram and the likes) which ever available and have been decided by the school-based committee).	10%

- 3. School-based committee will select three (3) winners (1<sup>st</sup> place, 2<sup>nd</sup> place, 3<sup>rd</sup> place). Each will receive certificate of recognition and token (whenever available). The judges' decision declaring the winners is final and irrevocable.

4. Each entry will be based on the following:

Criteria	Weight
Originality: The poster entry is distinct and novel that delivers extraordinary perspective and content.	40%
Relevance to the 2023 NDAW sub-theme: The poster effectively resonates and communicates the intended theme.	30%
Creativity: The poster have used design elements, colors and visual qualities to convey their message in captivating and engaging manner to the viewers.
