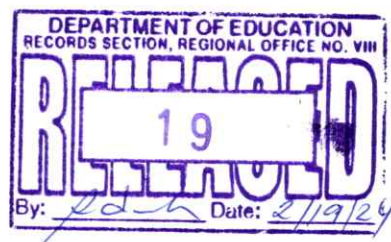
The target participants are the grade 11 learners, with their teacher-coaches, from both public and private schools.

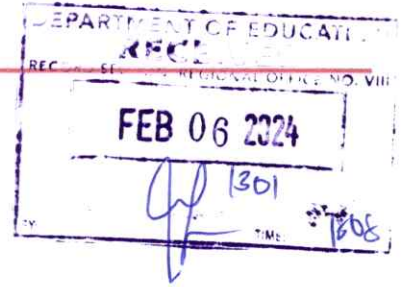

## QUIZ **B**: BRAINBOX ANNUAL QUIZ SHOW

### QUIZ SHOW PROPER

The quiz show proper is divided into three parts: the easy round, average round and the difficult round. The following table shows the number of questions, the corresponding points, and the time allotted to answer per question.

ROUND	NUMBER OF QUESTIONS	POINTS PER QUESTION	TIME ALLOTTED PER QUESTION	
			Mathematics	Science
EASY	twelve (12)	one (1)	30 seconds	30 seconds
AVERAGE	ten (10)	three (3)	1 minute	
DIFFICULT	eight (8)	five (5)	2 minutes	

The team with the highest total points will be declared the winner. If, after the tabulation of the results, a tie exists among two or more teams, a clincher round will be held to break the tie.

### GENERAL RULES FOR QUIZ SHOW PROPER

- a. The quiz master will read each question twice.
- b. Copies of the questions will be given to the contestants.
- c. The contestants can start solving DURING the first reading of the question. Only AFTER the second reading of the question and upon the quiz master's START signal will the contestants be allowed to write their answer.
- d. For Science questions that involve problem solving, the time limit for Mathematics will apply, depending on the round in which the Science question belongs. Other Science questions should be answered within 30 seconds.
- e. Answers must be clearly written and should not be erased unless given the signal to do so.
- f. Contestants should immediately stop writing once the STOP signal has been given.
- g. Upon the signal of the quiz master, teams must raise their illustration boards until the quiz master has checked their answers.
- h. When necessary, contestants will be made to explain their answer.
- i. Any form of cheating will not be tolerated. A team will be forced out of the competition for violating this rule.
- j. Should there be unforeseen difficulties regarding the conduct of the quiz show, the Board of Judges will have full prerogative to pass resolutions or meet contingencies.
- k. Protests may be raised right after the correct answer has been given but not before the next question is read.



- l. In case a team protests an answer, the Board of Judges has the sole authority to accept or reject the team's answer or invalidate the entire question. No partial points will be awarded.
- m. The decision of the Board of Judges will be final and irrevocable.
- n. Unless specified, answers to Mathematics and other numeric questions should be rounded off to two decimal places.
- o. Unless specified, surnames (but not first names) will be accepted as valid answers.
- p. The teams with the top three highest scores will be declared the winners. In case of a tie, clincher questions will be given until the tie is broken.
- q. These mechanics may be modified prior to the start of the competition. Any such changes will be communicated by mail or other electronic methods not later than seven (7) days from the day of the competition.
