- The Schools Division Offices shall encourage the teaching and non-teaching personnel to do the following:
  - check and prepare "Go Bags"; and
  - stockpile goods at home.

El Niño in the tropical Pacific Ocean continues to weaken but impacts such as hotter and drier conditions still persist. A transition to ENSO-neutral conditions is anticipated during the April-May-June (AMJ) to May-June-July (MJJ) 2024 season. However, a likelihood for La Nina to develop during the June-July-August (JJA) 2024 season has a 60% chance

With these conditions, the PAGASA ENSO Alert and Warning System still remains at El Niño Advisory / La Niña Watch. PAGASA will continue to monitor the weather and climate situation of the country. The public and all concerned agencies are advised to take precautionary measures against the possible impacts of the rainy season.

Further, all concerned government agencies and the public and advised to take the following preparedness measures:
