Theme

LEYTE 1944-2024

Bayani Ng Kahapon, Dakilang Huwaran ng mga Kabataan Ngayon ("Yesterday's Heroes, Today's Inspiration for the New Generation")

CONCEPT

The commemorative parade is held as a reminder of the events right after the landings when the liberation forces entered Tacloban to cheering crowds and the euphoria of a grateful people. The parade preceded the eventual re-establishment of the Commonwealth Government of the Philippines making the imposing Provincial Capitol of Leyte as seat of the national government on October 23, 1944 until February 1945.

Through this parade, we also wish to convey to the spectators the socio-economic and cultural gains that the Province of Leyte has achieved in the past 80 years after the war and the natural calamities that have ravaged its land and people. Because of the heroism of our veterans and the resilience of the people, we proudly celebrate today our victories... victories that mirrors the bravery and determination of our people.

With the Department of Education and its various schools in the different Divisions, the Organizing Committee led by the Provincial Government of Leyte, the City Government of Tacloban, we dedicate this parade to the people of Leyte, the country, and the world.

To the World who stood by us in our times of uncertainty, we say:

RE-ENACTMENT: RE-ESTABLISHMENT OF THE COMMONWEALTH GOVERNMENT AT THE PROVINCIAL CAPITOL OF LEYTE

Prologue:

Just 3 days after the successful Landings of the Allied Forces in various parts of Leyte, General DOUGLAS MACARTHUR wasted no time to re-establish the legitimate government of the Commonwealth of the Philippines once more back on Philippine soil after its exile when then President Manuel L. Quezon left for Australia and the United States.

And so, on 23 October 1944, with the new President Sergio Osmena by his side, and his Cabinet, he proudly announced the full re-establishment of the Commonwealth Government of FREE PHILIPPINES at the foot of the iconic terrace of the LEYTE PROVINCIAL CAPITOL.

As soon as the parading soldiers of the American Forces triumphantly arrived at the white-columned Leyte Provincial Capitol accompanied by the cheering townspeople of Tacloban shouting VICTORY JOE, the formalities of the occasion unwounded and recorded for posterity, thereby making THE CAPITOL the temporary SEAT OF GOVERNMENT for the fledgling COMMONWEALTH OF THE PHILIPPINES.
