FOR SPONSORS & BATCH PURCHASERS

Depending on their availability, we may have The Cast of Moving Up present on the film viewing date for a Meet & Greet with the students.

The physical tickets can serve as the project's official receipt. Should the purchasing party demand for an Official Receipt, corresponding additional taxes will apply. Circlestone Productions will not refund unused tickets.

LOGLINE

Moving Up is a story of Calvin, an estranged student who joins a group of tight-knit friends only to pursue his love interest.

But then he finds himself discovering the truer & deeper meaning of love.

SYNOPSIS

Moving Up starts with Calvin Adordionicio, a sixteen year-old junior high school student, who is told by his teacher, Ma'am De Guzman, to remove his red cap as it is not allowed inside the campus as per school policies. Reluctant to follow at first, Calvin had no choice but to obey his teacher. He takes his cap off and the whole classroom finds out that he has a bald spot on his head. Calvin suffers from alopecia. Ma'am De Guzman shuts down the class's grins and murmurs. She told them to not make fun of people just because of their unfamiliar situations. She even instructed the class to 'show some love' to Calvin by giving him a warm round of applause.

The class then proceeds to group themselves for the group assignments. Calvin being a transferee has no school friends yet. While his classmates are busy looking for groupmates, he's lost in his thoughts questioning the love found in a mere applause and wondering about the true meaning of love. He snaps back to reality as soon as his classmate, Leslie, approach him to join their group. He joins Leslie who is grouped with Karla and Dave.

Traumatized by his past experiences from his previous school, Calvin asks Ma'am De Guzman to let him report solo as it is of his least interest to work with groupmates. Eventually, Ma'am De Guzman allows him. However, Calvin falls head over heels with Grace. A Senior High student whom Calvin finds out is also a friend and a co-member in the theater organization of his supposed groupmates in Ma'am De Guzman's class. Calvin decides to pursue working with his groupmates.

Soon enough, Leslie figures out that Calvin has a crush on Grace. She gives Grace's number to Calvin. Leslie tries to convince Calvin to join their theater organization so he could be closer to Grace. Calvin strongly refuses. Calvin and Leslie continue to know each other better. Calvin sees Leslie as a true friend he has never had.

Calvin slowly become friends with Leslie, Karla & Dave as they continue to prepare for their report. The group is very supportive of Calvin's admiration of Grace. Lured to a possibility of a true love's kiss, Calvin gives in and joins the school's theater organization, Sining Ilaw. Although lacking in talent, Calvin gets accepted. He works hard to develop himself until he eventually becomes confident in himself.

With the intention of helping Calvin with his family problems, Leslie sets the group up for a trip to Baguio to find Calvin's older sister, Dana, who stowed away from them. Due to the latter's untimely pregnancy, Calvin's father, Nerry, has turned to alcohol and has been wreaking havoc in their household. This furthermore strengthen the group's bond. They learn each other's problems.

Sining Ilaw's lead actor for the play Leslie wrote which the whole organization is currently preparing for gets caught bringing illegal drugs in campus. The group gets infuriated as they know who the campus drug pusher is – Mac. Also Grace's suitor and soon-to-be boyfriend. This urges Calvin's to want to intimidate the notorious pusher.

Sining Ilaw chooses Calvin to be the new lead actor for the play. This prompts Calvin to work on his chemistry with Grace.

Calvin sees Grace continuing to be with Mac. This triggers him to finally try to intimidate Mac through a phone call. He borrows courage from his father's stock of alcoholic drinks in their house.

Mac eventually finds out that the mysterious phone call intimidation was from Calvin. Grace finds out about the call but only gets to know the half-truth – that the call was because Calvin sees Mac as a rival. Unbeknown to Grace that Mac is a drug pusher, she defends Mac and sends a tirade of personal insults to Calvin.













Calvin breaks down but eventually gets encouraged by Leslie. Leading him to fully accept his condition. He goes back to school and works hard on their play. They complete their final runthrough and Calvin wins the Best Performer of the Year Award on their Runthrough Awards – Sining Ilaw's pre-show awarding tradition.

The next day - play date, Calvin is excited to go to school to meet their call time. He is knocked unconscious with a baseball bat by Mac while walking. He doesn't make it to the show. The play gets cancelled and everyone is devastated. The audience is furious and the parents are worried. Especially Calvin's parents who eventually find him lying on a street pavement.

Weeks pass. Calvin doesn't really go out of his room. He is visited by Leslie. She forgives him and asks Calvin to not carry any guilt in his heart. Calvin is left wondering why Leslie's kindness is so otherworldly.

Covid lockdown starts. Nerry is stuck at home prohibited by the government to take his jeepneys for trips. Calvin finds out that Dana apologized to Nerry before their supposed show and the latter easily forgave his daughter. Nerry sees Calvin's Best Performer of the Year award. He tells Calvin that it's okay even if he didn't make it to the show. Tells him that what's important is that he's alive and is with them. Nerry and Calvin start to bond. Their family have become closer through the lockdown. Nerry and Daisy gifts Calvin a new cell phone as Mac stole his phone when he knocked him unconscious.

Calvin installs messenger and finds a plethora of messages. The latest being a video message of Leslie sent to their El Fili Groupchat. Leslie reveals that she is dying because of lupus. She bids farewell to Dave, Karla & Calvin. Tells them that she is now MOVING UP.

The movie ends with Calvin's poem about love. Showing how he appreciates the people around him. Dana comes back home bringing her baby and boyfriend with her. Nerry welcomes them with open arms. Karla now stands in for Leslie as a replacement daughter for her parents. Dave deletes his trashtalk page.

The poem ends revealing Calvin now in Senior High School reciting on their online class. The class ends and Calvin leaves. We see a photo of Calvin, Leslie, Karla and Dave beside Calvin's laptop.
